Important Notes:

- Courses below may not be offered each term. These courses have been offered in the past. The articulations below indicate the IU-Bloomington equivalent credit. Please check [program's site](#) for most up-to-date course offerings.
- Students should inquire with ksabroad@indiana.edu about business credit.
- Undistributed 100-level (-OS 100) courses have not yet been evaluated by an IUB department. Courses with a DEPT-OS 100 equivalent will be applied towards overall credits to graduate. However, students may submit the course materials to that department to be evaluated for specific credit either before or after studying abroad.
- If a course is listed as OS200/300/400, the course has been evaluated by the academic department. Be in touch with the academic department to determine how course may fulfill degree requirements.
- Some courses may carry pre-requisites; be sure to check the program's site to determine eligibility.
- The program includes extensive course-related excursions (themes and destinations may change):
 - The UK leaving the EU: visiting Berlin and Paris
 - Structure of the EU/EU Institutions: visiting Brussels, Frankfurt, Luxembourg, and Strasbourg
 - EU in one of three regions (examples of previous options):
 - Stockholm and Warsaw
 - Rome and Budapest
 - Athens and Bucharest or Sofia

Optional post-program internship (spring semester only):

IES internships require students to remain in Freiburg for a minimum of six to eight weeks after the conclusion of the EU Program. Internships begin at the end of the official IES semester (after course finals) and extend into July. Please note that the internship placement also carries an additional fee. Students will need to go through the [Non-IU program process](#) for the internship and will need to work with their academic departments to secure an IU course equivalent.
